

## ENGLISH 150

The English Composition Requirement, incorporated into the curricula for all baccalaureate degree programs, should be completed in the first year of enrollment. Placement in the appropriate level course is based on admission records as it pertains to SAT, ACT, IB or AP examinations. For international students, the score on TOEFL test is used in determining appropriate level of study.

The English requirement may be met in the following ways:

ENGL 148 Pre-requisite: Students may be placed in ENGL 148 if --

- ⇒ All international undergraduate students are required to take ENGL 148 unless they meet the SAT or ACT requirements
- ⇒ SAT Verbal - score of less than 510
- ⇒ ACT English - score of less than 21

### 1. Completion of ENGL 150, Expository Writing

A grade of C or higher must be earned -- students who earn a grade of D will be required to complete ENGL 180 Writing Tutorial with a grade of C or higher. ENGL 180 may be taken up to three times to achieve a C performance in English composition. The three credits of ENGL 148 and one credit of ENGL 180 will count toward the required liberal arts distribution.

2. Students who have achieved a score of 4 or 5 on the College Board Advanced Placement Examination in English will be granted the three credits for ENGL 150. These students are encouraged to complete an upper division English course during their time of study.

3. Transfer students: In order for transfer credit to be awarded in English, a student must have received a grade of C or higher and pass the English Placement examination given during the first class session of ENGL 150, or the student may have to pass ENGL 180 with a grade of C or higher.

Based on admission records or on the English Placement examination, a transfer student may be placed in ENGL 148, Introduction to Composition. ENGL 148 would need to be completed successfully with a grade of C or higher before taking ENGL 150. ENGL 148 will count towards the distribution of Liberal Arts requirements.
