

GENERAL EDUCATION

- Note #1 Student may be exempted from ENGL 148 if:
1. SAT Verbal score of 500 or higher
 2. ACT Composite score of 21 or higher
 3. Achievement Test in English score of 381 or higher
- Note #2 ENGL 150 Expository writing may be completed by:
1. College equivalent course (i.e. English II at many schools) with grade of “C” or higher
 2. AP English “Language/Composition”, or International Baccalaureate credit
- Note #3 Foreign Language Study requires that completion of language study equivalent to elementary level (@@@@102) is required. Students who only complete the first level [101] of study will not have those credits count toward fulfillment of General Education distribution.
