DIRECTOR'S WELCOME

What a joy and honor it is for me to present my first CIM Opera Theater production as the new Interim Artistic Director of Opera! When I directed *Dialogues des Carmélites* as a guest director earlier this year, I was so impressed by the diligence, talent, and exceptional training of CIM students. I was also taken by the concern of the voice/opera faculty for the success of their students cast in the opera. In my new position here at CIM, I am proud now to call these wonderful CIM performers "my students," and these thoughtful CIM faculty members "my colleagues."

I hope you enjoy our production of Handel's Alcina. It's an opera with EVERYTHING: exquisite arias, compelling dramatic situations, magical transformations, wild animals, mistaken identities, multiple disguises, and sudden reversals of fortune. And for an opera seria, it has more than a few moments of lightness and comedy! For these reasons, Alcina is one of Handel's most beloved dramatic works, and one of the composer's most frequently performed operas today.

As a stage director in a conservatory program, I find so much delight in seeing students grow during a production. Handel's operas pose unique challenges to young performers: lengthy and virtuosic da capo arias, challenging stretches of secco recitativo, and a dramatic/theatrical style that is not nearly as "natural" as the musical theater of Mozart, Donizetti, or Puccini. Our wonderful CIM voice students embraced these challenges very early in the process. As a result, they have risen to meet the demands of an extremely demanding work.

I wish to thank my production team, my CIM voice/opera colleagues, and the CIM administration for everything they have done to support this project and our students.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Dr. JJ Hudson (stage director) is recognized as a dynamic and sensitive director of lyric theater in professional, university, and summer-festival opera. His directing credits include works across the spectrum of lyric theater genres, and his productions have received outstanding reviews in *The New York Times*, *Opera News*, and numerous regional and online publications.

Since fall 2021, Hudson has held the Valerie Adams Professor of Practice in Opera at Georgia State University in Atlanta where he produces and directs the university opera productions and opera workshop. In February 2022, Hudson was named the new Artistic Director (beginning 2023) of the Harrower Summer Opera Workshop, a long-standing young-artist program in Atlanta.

Hudson has recently directed productions with Sarasota Opera (*Rita* and *II Segreto di Susanna*), Mississippi Opera (*La Bohème*), Natchez Music Festival (*La Bohème*), Lakes Area Music Festival (*Ariadne auf Naxos*, *Carmen*, *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, *La Belle Hélène*, *The Rake's Progress*), Tri-Cities Opera (*Tosca*, *II Barbiere di Siviglia*, *La Bohème*), Opera Tampa (*Così fan tutte*), Opera in the Heights (*La Fille du Régiment*), Asheville Lyric Opera (West Side Story), and Opera Roanoke (*South Pacific*, *La Cenerentola*).

Hudson is an in-demand guest director in university and young-artist opera programs. He has directed multiple productions at Temple University, Stony Brook University, Columbus State University, University of Kansas, and North Carolina School of the Arts. He has directed for young-artist programs including Opera in the Ozarks, Red River Lyric Opera, Opera Breve Vocal Intensive, and Miami Classical Music Festival. He has also served on the directing staffs of the Aspen Opera Theater, Oberlin in Italy, and Opera North.

Hudson holds a DMA in voice performance and literature and an MM in opera studies: stage direction from the Eastman School of Music, where he was a student of Steven Daigle and Carol Webber. He holds an MA in voice performance from the University of Iowa and a double BM from Stetson University in music composition and voice performance.

ABOUT THE CONDUCTOR & MUSIC DIRECTOR

Harry Davidson (conductor and music director, CIM Opera Theater) is in his 17th season as music director and conductor of CIM Opera Theater with this production. Since the spring of 2006, he has conducted over a hundred performances of more than thirty operas. In addition, Davidson supervised and conducted the score of a film of Purcell's *Dido and Aeneas* and a livestream video trilogy of operas based on Shakespeare plays. He is in his 25th year as music director and conductor of the Duke Symphony Orchestra and professor of the practice of music at Duke University.

In July 2000, he made his major orchestra conducting debut, leading the National Symphony Orchestra in concert at the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC. Davidson has guest conducted orchestras in Austria, Finland, and the US, including the Charlotte and Akron symphonies, as well as the symphony and chamber orchestras of the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music, where he has held residencies on two occasions. He has held the positions of associate conductor of the Wichita Symphony Orchestra, professor of music and director of orchestras at Wichita State University, conductor of the Cleveland Orchestra Youth Orchestra, and associate professor of music at the University of Akron. In the past, he has served as a cover conductor for the North Carolina Symphony and The Cleveland Orchestra.

Davidson was a finalist in the Detroit Symphony's Antal Dorati Conducting Competition and the Hans Swarowsky Conducting Competition in Vienna.

ABOUT THE PERFORMERS

Elizabeth Aranda (soprano) is a second-year master's student at CIM, studying with Mary Schiller. She completed her Bachelor of Music at Northern Arizona University. Her roles include: a Spirit in *Die Zauberflöte*, Emmie in *Albert Herring*, Nella in *Gianni Schicchi*, Suor Genovieffa in *Suor Angelica*, Sandrina in *La Finta Giardiniera*, a Spirit/La Fée (cover) in *Cendrillon*, Constance (cover) in *Dialogues des Carmélites*, and she performed with the Verde Valley Sinfonietta. She received third at the NATS Arizona District and the Lloyd and Sally Hanson Singer/Actor Award of Excellence Scholarship, and attended the Patti and Allan Herbert Frost School of Music Program at Salzburg.

Gillian Beckman (soprano) is a fourth-year Bachelor of Music student at CIM studying voice with Mary Schiller. She has sung the roles of Despina from *Così fan tutte*, Frasquita from *Carmen*, Lisette from *La Rondine*, The Dewfairy from *Hansel and Gretel*, and Barbarina from *Le Nozze di Figaro* in various opera scenes programs. She has an extensive piano background and works as a substitute voice and piano teacher at the Westlake Music Academy. Beckman has held both paid and volunteer positions singing for churches within the Diocese of Cleveland and Columbus.

Katniss Bi (mezzo-soprano) is a first-year Professional Studies student at CIM, studying with Dina Kuznetsova. Bi's stage credits include Périchole in *La Périchole* (CIM), Third Witch in *Macbeth* (CIM), Nora in the micro-opera *A Storm We Call Progress* (CIM), Sandman in *Hansel and Gretel* (Chicago Summer Opera), Cherubino in *Le nozze di Figaro* (Wuhan Conservatory of Music), Fantine in *Les Misérables* (WHCM), and Daisy in *Side Show* (Shanghai International Musicals Festival). She also sang as a young artist at the Master Players Festival & School held by the University of Delaware. She completed her Master of Music degree at CIM.

Catherina Carrington (soprano) is a second-year Bachelor of Music student at CIM studying with Dina Kuznetsova. Carrington was recently awarded honorable mention at Miami Frost School of Music's Mirabell Competition in Salzburg, first prize at Ohio NATS 2022, and was a Winner of Young Arts 2022. She performed her first full roles as La Fée and Constance in CIM's 2022-23 productions of *Cendrillon* and *Dialogues des Carmélites*. She was part of CIM's Opera Scenes program in 2022 and 2023 playing Adele in *Die Fledermaus*, Amy in *Little Women*, and Mademoiselle Silberklang in *Der Schauspieldirektor*.

Colin DeMatteo (baritone) is a second-year undergraduate student at CIM studying with Dina Kuznetsova. He has performed with CIM Opera Theater and Delphic Forge Inc. His stage credits include Marcus/Ghost cover (*Gracchus*), Papageno/Leporello (CIM Spring Scenes 2023), Thierry/2nd Commissaire (*Dialogues des Carmélites*), and chorus/Premier Ministre (*Cendrillon*).

Jingjing Fan (soprano) is a second-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Dina Kuznetsova. Fan has performed the role of a brave girl in the contemporary musical We are the Brave Ones in China. She also sang as a young artist at Songfest and studied with Martin Katz

and Kathryn Cowdrick in Nashville. Fan won first prize in the Prokofiev International Music Competition. She earned her undergraduate degree in voice performance from Xinghai Conservatory of Music in China.

Laura Fisk (soprano) is in her first year at CIM studying with Mary Schiller, as she pursues a Master of Music in voice performance. Fisk is originally from Pasadena, Maryland, and completed her undergraduate studies at Belmont University in Nashville, Tennessee. At Belmont University, she studied with Dr. Kristi Whitten and most recently performed the role of Cendrillon in Pauline Viardot's *Cendrillon*.

Caroline Friend (mezzo-soprano) is a fourth-year undergraduate student from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, studying with Dina Kuznetsova at CIM. Friend's stage credits include the Spirit from the 2021 CIM Opera film production of Dido and Aeneas, Dorothée from Massenet's Cendrillon, and Mère Marie from Poulenc's Dialogues des Carmélites. She has also made appearances in the opera program's concerts and Opera Scenes. She performed in the 65th Annual Sewanee Summer Music Festival & Operafest in 2022. Friend recently made her debut in the Czech Republic as Cherubino from Mozart's Le Nozze di Figaro during the 2023 Prague Summer Nights Music Festival. Recently, she was a featured soloist for a performance marking the 100th Anniversary of the Pittsburgh Beaver Valley Choral Society in October 2023.

Annalyn Gauger (soprano) is a fourth-year undergraduate student studying with Dina Kuznetsova. Stage credits include Soeur Mathilde in Poulenc's *Dialogues of the Carmelites* and First Sprite in Massenet's *Cendrillon*, both at CIM. In the summer of 2023 they attended the Si Parla, Si Canta program in Arona, Italy, and in the summer of 2022 they attended the Miami Frost School of Music program in Salzburg, Austria. Gauger is a Shari Bierman fellowship member of the Cleveland Orchestra Chorus and has performed at Severance Music Center and Blossom Music Center.

Yasmin Gerardi (soprano) is a third-year undergraduate student at CIM studying under the tutelage of Dina Kuznetsova. Gerardi's stage credits include many opera scenes such as Bastienne (Bastien und Bastienne), Pamina (Die Zauberflöte), Elisetta (Il Matrimonio Segreto), and Bianca (La Rondine). Gerardi received honorable mention at the Mirabell Competition in Salzburg, Austria (2023), finalist in the Schmidt Vocal Competition (2020), and second place in the Regional Division

of the Reston James Bland Classical Competition (2019). Gerardi is in touch with her Persian culture and performs Persian traditional music at times.

John-Joseph Haney (tenor), hailing from Norfolk, Virginia, is currently pursuing a master's degree in voice at CIM. He completed his undergraduate studies at the Mannes College of Music. Haney is a Shari Bierman Singer Fellow with The Cleveland Orchestra. Haney has been seen at various opera companies, both nationally and internationally. Recent performances include engagements with Virginia Opera in productions of La Bohème and Le Nozze di Figaro. Past roles include Ferrando (Così fan tutte), Don Basilio and Don Curzio (Le Nozze di Figaro), Monostatos (Die Zauberflöte), Paolino (Il Matrimonio Segreto), Premiere Commissaire (Dialogues des Carmélites), and also as the tenor soloist in Handel's Messiah. He recently made his European and role debut as Don Ottavio in Don Giovanni at the Estates Theatre in Prague.

Chuting Huang (soprano) is a first-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Dina Kuznetsova. Huang's stage credits include Mimi in *La Bohème* (Nanjing University of Art) and Pamina in *The Magic Flute* (Nanjing University of Art). Huang also sang in Korean and China International Vocal Competition and won first prize and second prize of the aria group. She completed her undergraduate voice performance degree at Nanjing University of Art.

Yuhang Huang (tenor) is a second-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Clifford Billions. Huang was a young artist at the 2019 Singapore National Music Festival and won the gold medal and bronze medal in the 2019 Prokofiev International Music Competition (voice). He also won the gold medal in the 2022 International Music Festival for Youth in Vienna. He completed his undergraduate opera and vocal performance degree at the Central Conservatory of Music.

Madison Hurst (tenor) is a second-year Graduate Diploma student from Springville, Utah. He studies with Clifford Billions. His roles include Le Chevalier in *Dialogues of the Carmélites* (CIM Opera), Fenton in *Falstaff* (CIM's Shakespeare: Operatically 2022), Gastone in *La Traviata* (Utah Valley University), Ferrando in *Così fan tutte* (Utah Vocal Arts Academy), and Eisenstein in *Die Fledermaus* (UVU).

Ku Liang (bass) is a first-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Dean Southern. Liang has participated in various

competitions during his undergraduate studies, such as the Guangxi Arts University Yiyuan Cup Vocal Competition and the Preliminary Competition of Opera Group of Vocal Singing. He completed his undergraduate music education with vocal emphasis at Guangxi Arts University. Liang is also interested in Chinese folk music and opera, and has performed in several concerts and events.

Mikayla Liu (soprano) is currently completing her Graduate Diploma at CIM studying with Mary Schiller. She completed her MA in vocal performance at the University of Iowa where she served as a graduate voice teaching assistant. This summer she attended AIMS opera institute wherein she sang recitals throughout Graz, Austria. Recent engagements include Alcina (Alcina), Donna Anna (Don Giovanni), Violetta Valery (La traviata), Carolina (Il matrimonio segreto), and Beatrice (3 Decembers). In addition to opera, Liu has sung in orchestral concerts as the soprano soloist in Johann Valentin Rathgeber's Missa in D and Hadyn's Missa Brevis.

Weizheng Ma (bass) is a first-year voice performance major at CIM, studying with Clifford Billions.

Ro Alia Mengert (soprano) is a first-year Bachelor of Music student at CIM studying with Mary Schiller. From 2022 to 2023, she was a member of the GTCC music pathway program where she studied classical and jazz vocals. From age 8, Mengert has performed in musicals such as *Annie* and *Anything Goes*.

Kwang Keun (Daniel) Oh (bass) is a first-year Graduate Diploma student at CIM, studying with Clifford Billions. He completed his undergraduate voice performance degree at Korea National University of Arts. Oh's stage credits include Dulcamara in Donizetti's L'Elisir d'Amore (Korea National University of Arts) and Emperor Kojong in Jung Yulsung's Become Wind and Clouds (Seoul Art Center).

Heedo Park (tenor) is a first-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Dean Southern. He completed his undergraduate vocal degree at Yonsei University.

Zara Smith (soprano) is a first-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Mary Schiller. Her previous roles include Jessie in *Mahagonny Songspiel* and Floriana in *Zazá* with the Crane Opera Ensemble. Smith participated in the Patti and Allan Herbert Frost

School of Music Program at Salzburg as well as Classical Singing and New York.

Isabella Sobkowicz (soprano) is a fourth-year Bachelor of Music student at CIM, studying with Mary Schiller. This coming winter, she will sing the role of Young Alyce in Tom Cipullo's Glory Denied with CIM Opera Theater. With CIM Opera Theater in the 2022-23 season, she has sung the role of La Fée in Massenet's Cendrillon and Constance in Poulenc's Dialogues of the Carmélites. In summer 2023, Sobkowicz sang the role of Miss Wordsworth in Britten's Albert Herring with the Harrower Summer Opera Program in Atlanta. In select scenes in CIM's opera scene programs, she has sung Susanna in Mozart's Le Nozze di Figaro, Mireille in Gounod's Mireille, Gretel in Humperdink's Hansel and Gretel, and the cover for Nannetta in Falstaff (Act II, Scene II). She was a student at the Miami Frost School of Music Patti and Allan Herbert Program at Salzburg during the summer of 2022.

Ruoxuan (**Nola**) **Tan** is a fourth-year undergraduate vocal performance student at CIM, studying with Dina Kuznetsova. Tan's stage credits include Mère Jeanne in *Dialogues des Carmélites* (CIM Opera Theater) and the 6th spirit in *Cendrillon* (CIM Opera Theater). She won the gold medal in Hongkong International Music Competition in both the regional and final rounds in 2019.

Yiyu Tang (soprano) is a second-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Dina Kuznetsova. In recent years, she has performed Noémie in Massenet's *Cendrillon*, Sœur Claire in Poulenc's *Dialogues des Carmélites*, Refugee in Jianping Tang's *The Diaries of John Rabe*, and she has played the partial roles of Donna Anna in Mozart's *Don Giovanni*, Violetta in Verdi's *La Traviata and* Marschallin in Strauss' *Der Rosenkavalier*.

Connor Vrooman (tenor) is a lyric tenor from Colfax, California. Vrooman studied classical voice at The College of Idaho. He performed roles such as Rinnucio from *Gianni Schicchi* and Frederick from *Pirates of Penzance*. Within his professional career, Vrooman has had solo performances with the Canyon County Symphony, Opera Elect, and Gemma Arts, as well as performed multiple works through contract with local composers. His performing is inspired by his folk singing background growing up in the rural Sierra Nevada mountains. Vrooman is currently studying with Clifford Billions at CIM.

Junchen Wan (baritone) is a first-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Clifford Billions. He received the gold medal in the Youth Group 2 (Bel Canto) at the 2021 International Art Masters World Tour Exhibition in Chengdu. He was also awarded the second prize for performers in the 16th Song Composition Competition at the Sichuan Conservatory of Music's Composition Department. His notable performances include the roles of Papageno in the first act of Die Zauberflöte, Notaio in Gianni Schicchi, and various roles in the Chinese national opera Zhuo Wenjun. He has actively participated as a baritone in various choirs and has contributed to multiple music salon performances and choral concerts.

Ziqi Wang (mezzo-soprano) is a second-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Mary Schiller. Wang's stage credits include ensemble in *Le Nozze di Figaro* (Fermo Church in Italy) and Dorabella in *Così fan tutte* (Nanyi Music Festiva). Wang won second prize of the National Vocal Music Leading Talent Training Program, second prize of the Colorado International Music Competition, and first prize of the Paris Art Society Music Competition. She completed her undergraduate voice performance degree at Nanjing University of the Arts.

Lisl Wangermann (soprano) is a first-year Artist Diploma student and studies with Dina Kuznetsova. Some of her previous roles include Blanche (Dialogues des Carmélites), Cendrillon (Massenet's Cendrillon), Dido (Dido and Aeneas), Della (The Gift of the Magi), and Euridice (Rossi's Orfeo). In 2023, Wangermann was a semifinalist for the Dallas Opera's Lone Star Vocal Competition and a finalist for the Nightingale Young Artist Competition. She won the 2021 Louis Sudler Prize in the Performing and Creative Arts from Yale University and received a 2020 Encouragement Award from the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions.

Zhengheng Wu (tenor) is a first-year Bachelor of Music student at CIM, studying with Clifford Billions.

Jianyu Yang (tenor) is a first-year Bachelor of Music student at CIM, studying with Dean Southern. Yang's stage credits include a special mention in the Beethoven Young Musician Competition 2023, second prize in The Best Singer of BRS Beijing Royal School 2021, and fourth prize in The Best Singer of BRS Beijing Royal School 2020.

Jingdian Zhou (tenor) is a first-year Master of Music student at CIM, studying with Clifford Billions. Zhou's stage credits include Ruzhou Zhang in *Yian* (China Conservatory of Music), Ruggiero in *Alcina* (CIM), and Nemorino in *L'elisir d'Amore* (Central Conservatory of Music). Ziv is the recipient of multiple awards and honors. Most recently, she was a competition winner of the 2023 Mirabell Palace Recital Competition in Salzburg, Austria, where she performed a recital during the highly coveted Salzburg Festival. Ziv is also the recipient of Martha Bell Sanders Excellence Award and the Dr. Samuel Baker Fund.

Brittany Merenda (projection designer) is an award-winning projection designer working in theater, opera, and dance throughout the country. Simmons is music director and conductor for Nightingale Opera Theater in Hudson, Ohio.

Robert Sunderman (set designer) graduated from the University of Iowa with a BFA, MA, and MFA 1982. He is a fine artist, scenic designer, scenic artist, and Iowa State University associate professor emeritus of theatre for 21 years. Prior to his work at ISU, he was the scenic designer at Iowa Public Television for 16 years. Sunderman has been teaching art classes at the Des Moines Art Center for over 30 years. He has designed and scenic painted over 284 shows during his career. He has received Iowa Film, National Broadcasting Designers, and Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival awards for his scenic designs and many fine art awards.
