Ensembles under Call's direction have performed nationally and internationally, and her students consistently achieve successful auditions in competitions, production casting and placement in high-level collegiate programs.

In addition to her faculty assignments, Call serves as preparatory advisor and as interim manager of pathway programs. Her experience in the field provides leadership, guidance, high-level support and oversight of Preparatory programs where she also serves as these programs' faculty liaison.

Prior to her current appointment at CIM, Call served as adjunct professor of music at the College of Wooster where she taught voice, choral conducting and conducted the Wooster Singers. She formerly served as the artistic director of Oberlin Choristers, a community-based children's choir program, and has over a decade of experience as a public school music educator.

She is a frequently requested conductor and clinician for honor choirs, choral clinics and teacher training workshops around the nation. As an advocate for life-long singing, she is devoted to the study and practice of healthy vocal technique – combining her skills as conductor, voice teacher and performer in both the private studio and choral rehearsal room.
